

## Combat Medic Service Scholarship Application

The Combat Medic Service Scholarship program is dedicated to respecting and supporting the commitments and sacrifices made by U.S. service men and women who provided health care services as a line medic and who were awarded the Combat Medic Badge as a result of this service. We hope in this small way, to help them continue to serve their fellow man and to achieve their dreams and scholastic goals.

Every life they touched they made better, this is one way that we can try to return the honor. In order to qualify for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be a high school graduate or have successfully completed a GED program
- Be accepted by or enrolled as a full time technical, undergraduate, or graduate student at an accredited college, university, or trade school (including professional certificate programs such as Paramedic) at the time the scholarship is awarded
- Be able to demonstrate the capacity for advanced academic achievement or technical proficiency as demonstrated by maintaining at least a 2.5 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) based on an un-weighted 4.0 grading system
- Have served, or be serving in the U.S. Military with a military occupational specialty of 68W (or service specific equivalent)
- If separated from service, must have separated from service under honorable conditions or be currently serving in the Reserves or National Guard
- Have been awarded the Combat Medic Badge (CMB) for service as a line medic who was engaged in actual ground combat and performed medical duties (including aviation units)
- While the intention of this scholarship is to facilitate continued education in any medical related field, there are no restriction or limitations placed on degrees, certificates, or majors

Scholarship awards are made to deserving college-bound or trade-school bound students at discretionary levels up to the amount of \$5,000 annually (\$2,500 per semester or \$1,250 per quarter respectively). Minimum, one-time scholarship awards of \$500 may also be awarded at the selection panel's discretion. Students are required to submit a brief autobiography and write a 1,000 to 1,500 word essay that addresses the following questions:

- How has their experience as a line medic impacted your life?
- What are your goals and intentions are towards the advancement or of understanding of medical, care, or relief and what are you ultimate goals in this area?

To qualify, a student must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident and must also *enter* a four-year accredited college or university or accredited trade-school within 12 months of the application deadline. Existing students are eligible to apply, however only one award will be made to any individual. Deadline for applications is March 15th.

Scholarship awards will be announced on a quarterly basis (March, June, September, December). Scholarship.Life will require all award recipients to provide their Social Security number and documentation verifying award of the Combat Medic Badge (DD214 if one is available, certificate of award if DD214 is not available).

The Funding Life Corporation will provide the scholarship payment to the recipients upon receipt

of official documentation of registration from the college/university/trade-school that he or she is attending in the following fall or spring (for example, sending a letter with proof of first semester's payment from the registrar's office). Should the scholarship winner fail to attend the school within the stated time period, the scholarship will be given to the first runner-up.

A selection committee will judge all timely submissions. Author identity will remain anonymous during the judging.

To help inspire others, scholarship winner and runners-up will agree to have his or her name, city, school and enrolled program published, they must also agree to have his or her essay published on the Scholarship.Life and Funding.Life websites and will provide an appropriate photo to be used for publicity purposes and for distribution to the media.

The Funding Life Corporation will also retain the right to publish the essay of the winner and runners-up and to allow other professional media organizations to publish selected excerpts. Non-compliance with any of these requirements will result in forfeiture of the title and award. The decision of the judges is final.

Please print and review the checklist below to make sure that you meet all of the scholarship requirements and have included all necessary documents needed to qualify for the Combat Medic Service scholarship.

## Eligibility

In order to qualify for this scholarship, applicants must meet the following requirements:

- Be a high school graduate or have successfully completed a GED program
- Be accepted by or enrolled as a full time training, undergraduate, or graduate student at an accredited college, university, or trade school (including certificate programs such as Paramedic) at the time the scholarship is awarded
- Be able to demonstrate the capacity for advanced academic achievement or technical proficiency as demonstrated by maintaining at least a 2.5 cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) based on an un-weighted 4.0 grading system
- Be serving or have served in the U.S. Military with a military occupational specialty of 68W (or service specific equivalent)
- Must have separated from service under honorable conditions or be currently serving in the Reserves or National Guard
- Have been awarded the Combat Medic Badge (CMB) for service as a line medic who was engaged in actual ground combat and performed medical duties (including aviation units)
- Family members of The Funding Life Corporation officers, board members, or employees are not eligible for scholarship awards

While the intention of this scholarship is to facilitate continued education in any medical related field, there are no restriction or limitations placed on degrees, certificates, or majors.

## Requirements

1. Provide a brief autobiography (essay style 500 words or less, CV or resume styles are not acceptable) in PDF format
2. Provide a current (appropriate) photograph in PNG or JPG format

3. Provide proof of award of Combat Medic Badge (DD214 or certificate of award)
4. Provide proof of service and status of discharge (DD214 or photocopy of military ID)
5. Provide subsequent official documentation of registration from the college/university/trade-school that he or she is attending in the following fall or spring in order to receive the scholarship monies
6. Provide PDF copy of 1,000 to 1,500 word essay (including essay title, word count and applicant's name and address) that addresses the following questions:
  - How has their experience as a line medic impacted your life?
  - What are your goals and intentions are towards the advancement or of understanding of medical, care, or relief and what are you ultimate goals in this area?

To qualify, materials must be submitted in electronic format to The Funding Life Corporation by 11:59 p.m. (ET) on March 15.
